

Evolution in wild birds

Moderate level of HPAI cases in wild birds, mainly gull birds, cranes and wild ducks affected

The virus persisted in Germany during summer 2023

Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania: Turkeys for fattening,


Thuringia: Rare breeds

Lower saxony: Back yard holding


Measures are in place, Epidemiological investigation is ongoing

Situation in **poultry** and **captive birds**

Period of time	Number of outbreaks
Active outbreaks on 22/11/2023 (13/07/2023)	3 (11)
New from 13/07/2023 (~last PAFF) until 22/11/2023	3 Zoo: 0 Poultry: 1 NON-Poultry: 2
New season from 01/10/2023 until 22/11/2023	3 (0 lifted)



Evolution: **Poultry** and **captive birds**





Summary

- Number of cases in wild birds moderate
- Infection pressure in the wild bird population is increasing due to autumn bird migration
- Consequence: First HPAI outbreaks in poultry and captive birds
- **Measures** in place
- Still essential: awareness, biosecurity
