29 April
2017

Main date of application:

14 December 2019



Structure of the 2017/625 OCR

General Principles (Articles 1 - 15)

Scope; definitions; transparency; responsibilities of Competent Authorities and business operators

Sector Specific Requirements (Articles 16 – 27)

e.g. products of animal origin; residues; animal welfare; plant health ,GMOs; organic, PDOs, PGIs, TSGs; new risks

Article 28-33: Delegation of tasks Article 34– 42: Sampling, analyses, tests & Diagnoses Article 43 – 76: Import controls

Article 77-91: Financing & official certification Article 92– 101: EURLs & EURCs

Article 102-108: Administrative Assistance & Cooperation

Procedural and transitional provisions (articles 142 – 167)

Outcome of meetings with Member States in October & November: focus on "Entry into the EU"

COM presented to MS:

- the issues (empowerments) &
- the timing when Competent Authorities can expect first ideas from the Commission

General agreement to proceed with multi-layer communication channels (CVOs, CPHOs, HoA...)

Empowerments

15.12 MS meetings: on entry into the EU (DA/IA)

- Derogations from certain BCPs requirements: Art. 62.3, 64.2, 64.5
- Specific training requirements: Art. 49.5
- Additional categories of products to be checked at BCPs (such as composite products, hay and straw Art. 47.3

• Import conditions: Art. 126(1) and products of animal origin: Art. 18

- BCP facilities: Art . 64.4
- Manifests + pre-notification:
 Art. 15.4 + 58.b
- List of animals and goods to be checked at BCPs (including Common Nomenclature codes)
 Art. 47.2(a)
- Temporary increase of official controls: Art. 47.2b, 54.4 (Repeal of R. 669/2009 on the increased level of official controls on imports of certain feed and food of non-animal origin)
- Entry into the EU **not through BCP** (section I): traceability of animals and goods on which samples have not been taken,

Art. 46.2





Discussion on Art 18 meat inspection (1)

- Two consultation with Member States (June, October 2017);
- 8 November 2017: Ad-hoc consultation meeting with Advisory Group for the Food Chain

Discussion focussing on 3 main issues:

- AMI in slaughterhouses
- Post-mortem inspection (PMI)
- practical arrangements PMI:
- Non-compliance
- microbiological hazards





Art 18, meat inspection (2)

- 15 December 2017: Specific WG on controls live bivalve molluscs;
- 18 and 19 January 2018: third consultation MS (to be scheduled every 2 months);
- End of 2018: adoption by Commission;
- 14 December 2019: date of application.

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Relocation of EURLs

8 EURLs in UK

- 1. Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies
- 2. Foot-and-mouth disease
- 3. Avian influenza
- 4. Newcastle disease
- 5. Crustacean diseases (contract ends 1-7-18)
- 6. Contamination of bivalve molluscs
- 7. Bluetongue
- 8. Swine Vesicular Disease





Intended situation 1 January '19

- 1. Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies (IT)
- 2. Foot-and-mouth disease (BE-FR consortium)
- 3. Avian influenza and Newcastle disease
- 4. Fish Diseases and Crustacean diseases (DK)
- 5. African horse sickness and bluetongue (ES)


Approach to consultations

- ⇒ Each empowerment will be discussed with Member States (expert groups + working groups)
- ⇒ Once consensus is reached on preliminary ideas COM consults SANTE advisory group (DA & IA)
- COM will consolidate the draft and inform the SANTE advisory group on progresses
- ⇒ DA sent to EP/Council: start of the scrutiny period
