## **Project goals**



The project "Quantifying the impact of European Food Banks – From Farm to Fork" pursues the following objectives:

- Sharing a standardised and consistent methodology for data collection across FEBA Members;
- Assessing the impact of FEBA Members taking into consideration the economic, environmental, nutritional, and social impacts;
- Defining how to make sense of the information for the purpose of impact management and measurement; and
- Encouraging digital transformation within our membership.







#### Results



- Finalisation of the list of 89 reviewed indicators divided into 11 categories
- 2 Finalisation of the definition of indicators
- Identification of 10 KPIs > Total number of Food Banks, Number of charitable organisations, Number of end beneficiaries, Number of end beneficiaries under 18, Number of end beneficiaries over 18, Food In, Food Out, Total number of co-workers, Regular volunteers, Number of partner companies
- Release of a new version of the online platform

#### **Outcomes**



- 1 All FEBA Members used the online platform
- 2 2021 data entails information from both FEBA Full and Associate Members
- FEBA's support to members
- 4 Several online meetings with members of the Pilot Group and additional FEBA Members
- Raising awareness on the importance of data amongst FEBA Members



CONTRIBUTION OF FEBA MEMBERSHIP TO OUR CIRCULAR FOOD SYSTEM IN

2021



In some countries such as Estonia, Germany, and the Netherlands, FEBA Members redistribute food not only to other charitable organisations but also provide food directly to end beneficiaries. This is the aggregation of data provided by FEBA Full Members and Associate Members at European level. In the case of Tafel Deutschland e.V., the data for food quantities is based on an estimation.

## **Surplus food recovery in 2021**



Percentage of surplus food\*: 54%

Largest share of food stemming the manufacturing sector

Solely a small percentage is recovered from the HORECA and catering sector

Total amount includes an important quantity of fruits and ables, incl. from the EU F&V withdrawal scheme

<sup>\*</sup>Due to diverging data collection methods on national and local level, this percentage is an estimation.

#### What's next?





**Assessment:** Further analysation of the 2021 data collected from FEBA Members



Fine tuning: Tweaking the definitions of indicators and KPIs;



Improvement: Increasing the user-friendliness of the online platform;



Backtracking: Developing a feature to review historic data;




**Implementation:** Start of pilot project entailing the use of the platform by regional/local Food Banks.



**Integration:** Evaluation of the possibility to synchronise the platform with FEBA Members' national data collection systems;
