Why this Own Initiative?

Fish are sentient beings and can feel pain (OIE, 2008, EFSA, 2009) and EU regulations require that we pay full regard to their welfare.

Fish are more sensitive to their environment than terrestrial animals, their immune system more affected by stress, and only a very few medicines and vaccines are available to fish farmers.

Welfare is very important in aquaculture for ensuring robust fish, and this very young industry now has the chance to develop with this principle.

Taking this into account, the work of our own initiative is based on the fact that farmers, competent authorities and the public need to have updated and clear guidelines in order to be able to best ensure fish welfare.

Species specific chapters then give detail on the specific parameters and recommendations for that species: trout, seabass, seabream and carp.

Guides to good animal welfare practice for the handling of farmed fish developed by the voluntary initiative subgroup on fish.
