Update: Implementing Regulation laying down special ASF control measures

Document SANTE/7260/2020

- discussed in the Committee on 11 February 2021
- endorsed by the Committee (via a written procedure) launched on 12 February 2021
- translations ongoing (deadline 19 March)
- adoption and publication in the OJ (as soon as possible)
- Upcoming revision of Annex I (list of restricted zones I, II, III) document SANTE/7090/2021
 - internal procedure (ongoing)
 - A written procedure to consult MS to be launched
 - list of restricted zones I, II and III should be aligned with the latest Annex of Commission Implementing Decision 2014/709/EU

Update of EU guidelines: objectives

- Alignment with the new legal framework:
 - Regulation (EU) 2016/429 (AHL)
 - Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687
 - Implementing Regulation (EU) [7260/2020] laying down special ASF control measures



Update of EU guidelines

- The Strategic approach to the management of African swine fever for the EU.
 - (SANTE/7113/2015 Rev. 13)
- The Principles and criteria for geographically defining ASF regionalisation.
 - (SANTE/7112/2015 Rev. 4)



Main changes

- References to legislation
- Alignment with new legal provisions
- Terminology used, such as:
 - Outbreaks in domestic pigs and cases in wild boar = outbreaks
 - Domestic and feral pigs = kept and wild porcine
 - Farms = establishments
 - Part I, II, III, IV = Restricted zones I, II, III
- EFSA (where relevant)

- Revision of SANTE/7113/2015 (Rev. 13) & SANTE/7112/2015 (Rev. 4)
 - documents to be shared with MSs as soon as possible
- Comments by MSs (in writing)
- Discussion at the next PAFF
 - (provisional) 22-23 April 2021
- Publication on Commission's website
