## **2023 ANNUAL REPORT**



With some 47 million tonnes of cereals processed each year, the European flour millers are the largest single food users of domestic wheat, rye and oats. The sectors employs over 45 000 people – mostly in Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) - and an estimated 350 000 indirect labour at European farm level.

**CONGRESS CONFERENCE**: We organise a conference session to address members on "delivering on climate change & biodiversity in a context of soaring energy and grain prices" in the context of the European Flour Milling Congress that took place on 26-28 May 2022 in Italy, including:

- Carbon farming & trading: the business model to reward cereal growers for carbon sequestration & biodiversity protection (IDDRI & ScPo Paris)
- A flour miller's appreciation of bread avoids food waste (Meyerhans Mühlen AG)
- The Mulino Bianco Charter for sustainability from farmers to consumers (Barilla)



Explore the possibility of developing sector-specific tools and resources in support of this Code

- GREEN CLAIMS: at the level of the association Board and ad-hoc committees, ongoing discussions & consultants approached on the possibility to launch a Product environmental footprint category rules (PEFCR) for wheat flour to substantiate green claims at flour milling sector level at the light of the European Commission Proposal issued on 23 March 2023.
- **CARBON FARMING**: at the association Board meeting of 2 May, European millers welcomed the establishment of an EU regulatory framework for the certification of carbon removals as an essential steppingstone towards achieving a net contribution from carbon removals, in line with the EU climate-neutrality objective for 2050. Millers should be allowed to claim removals generated within their supply chain (wheat, rye and oats) as a priority, while certificates should be made available to the entire value chain but not beyond it.



Continue to engage in dialogue with other food chain/systems actors and EU and international policy-makers to forge (new) relationships, exchange good practices and discuss challenges encountered, learn from each other (studies, projects) and create better mutual understanding, and identify opportunities for collaboration and potential partnership

- CARBON FARMING CERTIFICATION: European Flour Millers are also engaging in dialogue with other vegetal first-processing sectors to address regulatory aspects related to the Green Deal and Farm-to-Fork Strategy. On 25 April 2023, the platform organized for its member companies a workshop to understand the opportunities and challenges related to soil carbon sequestration and emission reduction through a deep dive into the Commission carbon certification proposal, with DG CLIMA as key-note speaker. In November 2022, PFP held a Forum under the title 'Rising to the challenges of climate change and energy supplies' (aspirational objective 3) in a context of dramatically rising energy costs, the purpose was to discuss how to overcome pressure as primary food processing sectors are looking to intensify investments in decarbonization.
- BREAD VALUE CHAIN: At the level of the Bread-Initiative Platform gathering all the actors of the bread value chain, European Flour Millers contributed to engage in dialogue on the impact of the farm-to-fork strategy regulatory context with an emphasis on health and nutrition relating to bread.



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
