# Labelling of alcoholic beverages



#### Context

- The European Commission adopted the <u>Europe's Beating</u>
   <u>Cancer Plan</u> on 3 February 2021
- Announcement of COM proposal to introduce the "mandatory indication of the list of ingredients and the nutrition declaration on alcoholic beverage labels"



### **Problems**

- Alcohol-related harm is a major public health concern in the EU
- Excessive alcohol intake increases the risk of obesity and related noncommunicable diseases
- Currently the FIC Regulation exempts alcoholic beverages containing more than 1.2% by volume of alcohol from the obligation to bear a list of ingredients and a nutrition declaration on labels:
  - reduced level of consumers' awareness
  - fragmented landscape: uneven playing field for operators and consumers' concerns only partly addressed



### **Inception Impact Assessment**

#### Policy options


- Option 0 Baseline ('business as usual') to maintain the current exemption that alcoholic beverages above 1.2 % of volume of alcohol do not have to bear the list of ingredients and nutrition declaration
- Option 1 Revise the rules for all alcoholic beverages to revoke the exemption and allow certain indications off-label
- Option 2 Revise the rules for all alcoholic beverages to revoke the exemption and require all indications on-label



### Inception Impact Assessment

Public feedback (24 June until 22 July 2021)

# Study supporting the IA



### Study to support the Impact Assessment

#### Purpose and scope of the study

- Identify and collect evidence and carry-out a detailed and data-driven analysis
- Gather evidence, views, opinions from all relevant stakeholders and consult them on the various policy options
- Analyse and compare the economic, social and environmental impacts of the proposed policy options

#### Tasks

- Develop the methodology for the IA
- Stakeholder consultations
- Case studies
- Analysis and comparison of the policy options



### Stakeholder consultations

#### Public consultation

- Collect views of citizens and stakeholders
- Planned mid December
- In all EU languages, open for 12 weeks on 'Have your Say' portal
- Separate questions for the different topics, with possibility to select topic(s) of interest
- Closed questions and option to raise other issues



### Stakeholders consultations

- Targeted consultations
  - Targeted surveys (pre-registration webpage)
    - MS competent authorities
    - Food business operators
    - Consumer and public health associations
    - SMEs (in collaboration with Enterprise Europe Network)
  - Interviews (for each topic; focus on stakeholders not covered by case studies)
  - Workshops (FOPNL & nutrient profiles; origin labelling; alcoholic beverages)
- Case studies (for each topic)



# Additional input to IA



### Additional input to Impact Assessment

- EFSA Scientific advice for development of harmonised mandatory front-ofpack nutrition labelling and setting of nutrient profiles for restricting nutrition and health claims on foods
  - EFSA public consultation <u>open until 9 January</u>
     <u>https://www.efsa.europa.eu/en/news/science-behind-nutrient-profiling-have-your-say</u>
  - Scientific opinion by March 2022
- JRC FOP literature review
  - Update with scientific publications since March 2018
  - In addition, focus on specific aspects
    - e.g. combined presence FOP & claims, single ingredient & traditional products, impact on different socio-economic groups...

### Additional input to Impact Assessment

- Date marking
  - EFSA Guidance on date marking (October 2020 and March 2021)
  - Consumer research study
- JRC literature review on the indication of origin on food labels
- JRC Exploratory study on information through other means than on labels, including digital means
- JRC market analysis of alcoholic beverages labelling (ingredients and nutrition declaration)
