

BT outbreaks

- BTV-3 outbreaks occur by now only in the two Länder located in the vicinity of the NL-DE border: Lower Saxony and North Rhine-Westphalia
- Up to 19 January 2024: 32 outbreaks
 - 27 bovine keeping establishments (blue dots)
 - 5 ovine keeping establishments (red dots).






Tabelle: Übersicht der Fälle von Blauzungenkrankheit im Jahr 2024, Stand 18.01.2024

BTV-zoning unchanged


Without status free of BTV three Länder:

- 1. Free Hanseatic City of Bremen
- 2. North Rhine-Westphalia
- 3. Lower Saxony


All other 13 Länder: status free of BTV !

- Supplementary movement requirements in force between free and not-free zones;
- Requirements for movement of bovine, ovine and caprine animals have been extended to all species listed for BTV in Annex to CIR (EU) 2018/1882; <u>https://food.ec.europa.eu/system/files/2023-12/ad_control-</u>

Conclusions

- Winter time:
 - Limited spread of the virus in the affected region;
 - Mostly only one animal positiv in an establishment;
- Enhanced awareness and surveillance in the entire territory of Germany;
- Further spread of the disease in springtime expected.
- The availability of an adequate vaccine against BTV-3 would very useful.
