Priorities of Latvian Presidency

- Improvement and enhancement of competiveness of the EU's agricultural production and food sector in the EU and global market
- Sustainable forest management model based on EU Member state's experience
- Sustainable management of fisheries resources multiannual fisheries management plans



Legislative proposals (1)

Animal Health Law (AHL)

- •The Council and the European Parliament (EP) has reached a provisional political agreement on June1 (2015) in 5 trilogues and 14 technical meetings
- •COREPER I confirmed agreement of the final compromise text on June 10
- •The EP had a vote in COM AGRI on June17
- AHL will be formally adopted in the autumn
- •AHL (and related delegated and implementing legislative acts) will become applicable after 5 years of its entry into force



Legislative proposals (2)

Official Controls Regulation

State of play

- •Aim to prepare the Council`s position and the mandate for negotiations with European Parliament
- •So far the Presidency's suggestions of the compromise text has been exanimated at 4 (8,5 days) joint expert (veterinary/phytosanitary) working group meetings and 6 attaché meetings



Legislative proposals (3)

Regulation on Organic farming

- Aim to reach general approach at June AGRIFISH Council meeting
- •Intensive work at expert working group meetings, SCA meetings, AGRIFISH Council meetings



Legislative proposals (4)

Novel Food Regulation

- Presidency actively continued the negotiation process with the European Parliament
- •2 informal trilogues during Latvian Presidency
- •Provisional agreement reached on principal issues «cloning», nanomaterials, precautionary principle, except delegated acts
- The final Council's offer is a subject for consideration to the European Parliament



Legislative proposals (5)

Regulation on Veterinary Medicinal Products State of play

- Technical examination of the Commission's proposal in Council expert working group
- •5 expert working group meetings



Legislative proposals (6)

Regulation on Medicated Feed State of play

- •Finalization of technical examination of the Commission's proposal
- Preparation of compromise text and examination of the Presidency's suggestions
- •3 expert working group meetings



Legislative proposals (7)

Regulation on Zootechnical and Genealogical Conditions State of play

- •4 expert working group meetings
- Preparation of compromise text and examination of the Presidency's suggestions

Non - Legislative events (1)

Biosecurity- fundament for animal health Workshop organized in Rīga in co-operation with the Commission

- Organized in the context of AHL which introduces the principle of biosecurity as one of the key tools for the prevention
- Participants: experts from the EU Member States and candidate countries and the third countries bordering with the EU



Non - Legislative events (2)

Biosecurity- fundament for animal health

- Biosecurity is a "mindset" or "philosophy" that must be developed by producers
- It requires the adoption of a set of attitudes and behaviours by people to reduce risk in all activities.
- There is no "one fits all" solution biosecurity should be adapted to present risks



Non - Legislative events (1)

Biosecurity- fundament for animal health Conclusions

- Good biosecurity is a vital part of keeping new diseases away from animals
- •A good biosecurity is always essential- diseases may not always be apparent, especially in the early stages.
- •A good biosecurity is based on a partnership involving livestock producers, veterinarians and official authorities.
