# 4. Discussion and possible approval by the Sub Committee of a report on Emergency Vaccination against Foot and Mouth Disease

# Rapporteur: Prof. Panina

In the absence of Prof. Panina, Dr Ahl presented this draft report to the Committee. This consisted firstly of reviewing the work completed on the first section of the document at the previous meeting. Specific written comments, both on this section and on the remainder of the draft, had been introduced by two members and these were reviewed.

The sub committee then commenced a detailed, line by line, examination of the entire document and agreed several amendments to the text. Specific areas were identified where additional information was required. Dr Ahl and Prof. Panina were requested to consider these points with the assistance of the working group if necessary.

The draft document will be discussed again at the next meeting of the subcommittee. If approved it can be discussed at the plenary meeting of the Scioentific Committee on Animal Health and Animal Welfare in March.

## 5. Miscellaneous

Dr Garrido-Abellan, rapporteur of the working group dealing with Brucella melitensis, gave a detailed account of the

issues involved in this question. There were problems relating both to the tests used, the efficacy of vaccines and the incidence of this zoonosis appeared to have increased in some regions recently. It was anticipated that the working group would meet for the first time in the near future.
