DEVELOPING EU ANIMAL WELFARE LEGISLATION


- A majority of the respondents (88%, 22/24) considered the existing EU animal welfare legislation is not comprehensive enough
- There is a need for additional legislation where no detailed legislation currently exists (87%, 20/23)

• Most of the respondents supported the idea of a single EU animal





WHICH PIECES OF LEGISLATION DO YOU FEEL NEED TO BE AMENDED?




THE WELFARE OF DOGS AND CATS INVOLVED IN COMMERCIAL PRACTICES



- A majority of the respondents (79%, 19/24) saw a need for EU-level regulation in the form of
 - Independent animal welfare legislation or
 - Part of wider legislation covering, for instance, health and identification


EU PLATFORM ON ANIMAL WELFARE


NATIONAL CONTACT POINTS (NCP)

 - Communication doesn't always work
 - Only 1 meeting per year




Respondents supported an animal welfare labelling scheme (83%, 19/23)

STRATEGIC WAY FORWARD

- The EU Animal Welfare Strategy 2012-2015 generally considered to be sufficiently ambitious
- A majority of the respondents (88%, 22/25) considered that a new welfare strategy is needed
