Primary outbreak



• 27.1.2015 Suspicion of IBR-infection

 Cattle in an export-stable of a company in Söll (Tyrol, district Kufstein) showed not negative IBR-results!

Taken measures

- Notification
- Movement ban on all facilities of the company: company has access to facilities at three places: Tyrol (Söll, district of Kufstein, and Imst) and Upper Austria (Rutzenmoos, district Vöcklabruck)
- Epidemiological investigations started

Investigations



Tracing forward/tracing back:

- Contact farms in all federal provinces except Burgenland and Vienna
- AGES-investigations: 661 holdings, > 8.600 samples
- 26 positive holdings (306 positive animals): 2 Vorarlberg, 18 Tyrol, 1
 Upper Austria, 5 Lower Austria

Action taken I



- 30 January 2015:
 - Obligatory investigations for exports to third countries
- 20 February 2015 (Order to provincial Govenor)
 - Prohibition of cattle markets, agricultural cattle auctions, cattle shows until 28.02.2015
 - Since 1 March: obligatory IBR/IPV investigations for bovines before going to a market
- 24 February 2015:
 - Investigation of bulk milk samples is allowed
 - Exception for holdings with no trade since 05.12.2014

Action taken II



09 March 2015:

- Before intra-Community trade, a negative test for IBR is obligatory
- Reference to the requirements of the intra-Community trade, CH included

22 April 2015

 Obligatory IBR-tests for animals or negative test result of the herd of origin for intra-Community trade including CH

Further investigations



Additional investigations:

```
> 35.180 blood samples > 6.890 holdings
```

> 10.220 bulk milk samples > 5.670 holdings

> 45.400 samples > 12.560 holdings

Total number of holdings: > 65.200

- Almost 20% of all holdings in Austria tested!
- Last outbreak 20 March 2015!

State of play



2 holdings still under restriction

- 1 in Tyrol, no animals in the holding
- 1 in Upper Austria, fattening stock, slaughter in progress
