






Context of the study



- Foreseen under the EU Animal Welfare Strategy 2012-2015
- Commission audits have indicated that information of best practices is particularly needed in certain areas like:
 - Slaughter of animals in small slaughterhouses (poultry and mammals);
 - Development of standards operation procedures;
 - Slaughter of poultry using electrical waterbath;
 - Slaughter of animals without stunning in the context of ritual slaughter;
 - Killing on farm.
- Study contractor company: ICF







Objectives and approach

- To provide, assess and evaluate information in order to elaborate elements for best practices.
- For this purpose:
 - Collect information on current practices;
 - Analyse and compare information sources and identify gaps;
 - Draft elements for best practices;
 - Consult stakeholders;
 - Finalize elements for best practices.
- The intended audience were business operators, including animal welfare officers in slaughterhouses.






Qualification of the practices


UNACCEPTABLE practices are forbidden by law.



ACCEPTABLE practices are authorised or required by law and provide limited animal protection.



■ GOOD practices are authorised or required by law and provide good animal protection.



BEST practices are authorised or required by law and (a) provide enhanced animal protection, or
(b) they provide other benefits (for instance: they are more practical, or more cost-effective).







State of play

Scope

- Existing materials developed by broad spectrum of stakeholders
- 10 MS, third countries, international organisations & NGOs

Tools

- Data collection protocol, online tools
- Survey of country contacts

Analysis

- Review of documents
- Comparative analysis
- Gap analysis







- The feedback on the drafts was positive overall
 - including numerous suggestions for improvement

101 submissions came from all stakeholder groups

Concerns

- Status of the documents (i.e. obligations for stakeholders)
- Risk of encouraging practices that are not seen as desirable in some countries
- Scope of the documents
- Religious organisations concerns






Main elements of best practices

- **Slaughterhouse operations** for Equids, cattle, pigs, sheep, goats and poultry (chicken and turkey):
 - Layout, construction and equipment of slaughterhouse
 - Handling and restraining
 - Stunning
 - Control and monitoring procedures
- Slaughter without stunning (prescribed by religious rites)
- On farm killing for Equids, cattle, pigs, sheep, goats, poultry and rabbits
 - Basic rules







