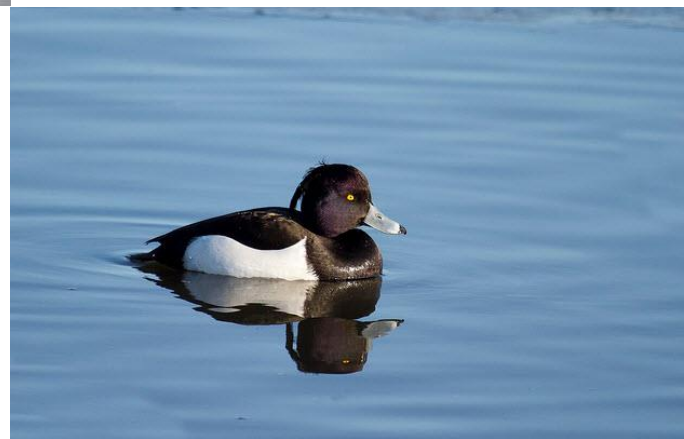

HPAI in Poultry

Past outbreaks in poultry/other captive birds

(information already provided at previous meetings)

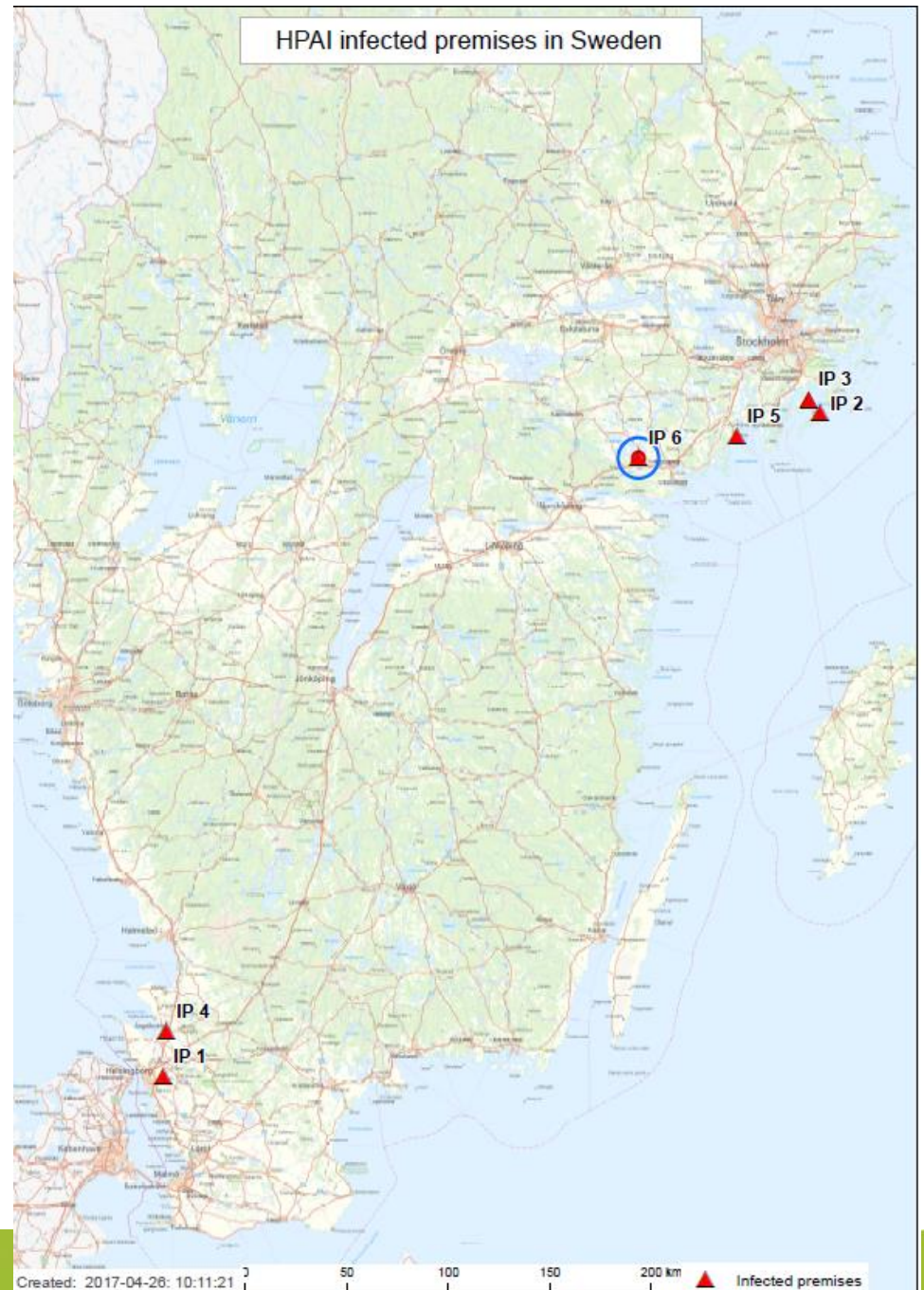
Outbreak	Date of confirmation	Facility
IP 1	23/11/2016	Commercial herd, laying hens, Skåne.
IP 2	21/12/2016	Backyard farm, non-commercial holding situated on an island (Utö), out in the south part of the archipelago of Stockholm.
IP 3	27/01/2017	Backyard farm, non-commercial holding with 19 poultry and 13 common quail, situated on an island Muskö in the archipelago of Stockholm.
IP 4	2/02/2017	A small city park zoo with hens, pheasants and a musk duck situated in Skåne.
IP 5	2/02/2017	Small backyard holding with poultry situated in Trosa in Södermanland.

HPAI in Poultry

One new outbreak in poultry

IP 6 (Confirmed:
24/04/2017)

- Holding with 50 000 laying hens in the municipality of Nyköping.
- Holding consists of two houses and four separate compartments.
- All necessary measures according to Directive 2005/94 are applied. Protection and surveillance zones (3 and 10 km respectively) have been established around the holding.
- Culling of animals concluded as of 27 April 2017.
- Preliminary infection concluded as of 29 April 2017.
- Cleaning and disinfection is ongoing.



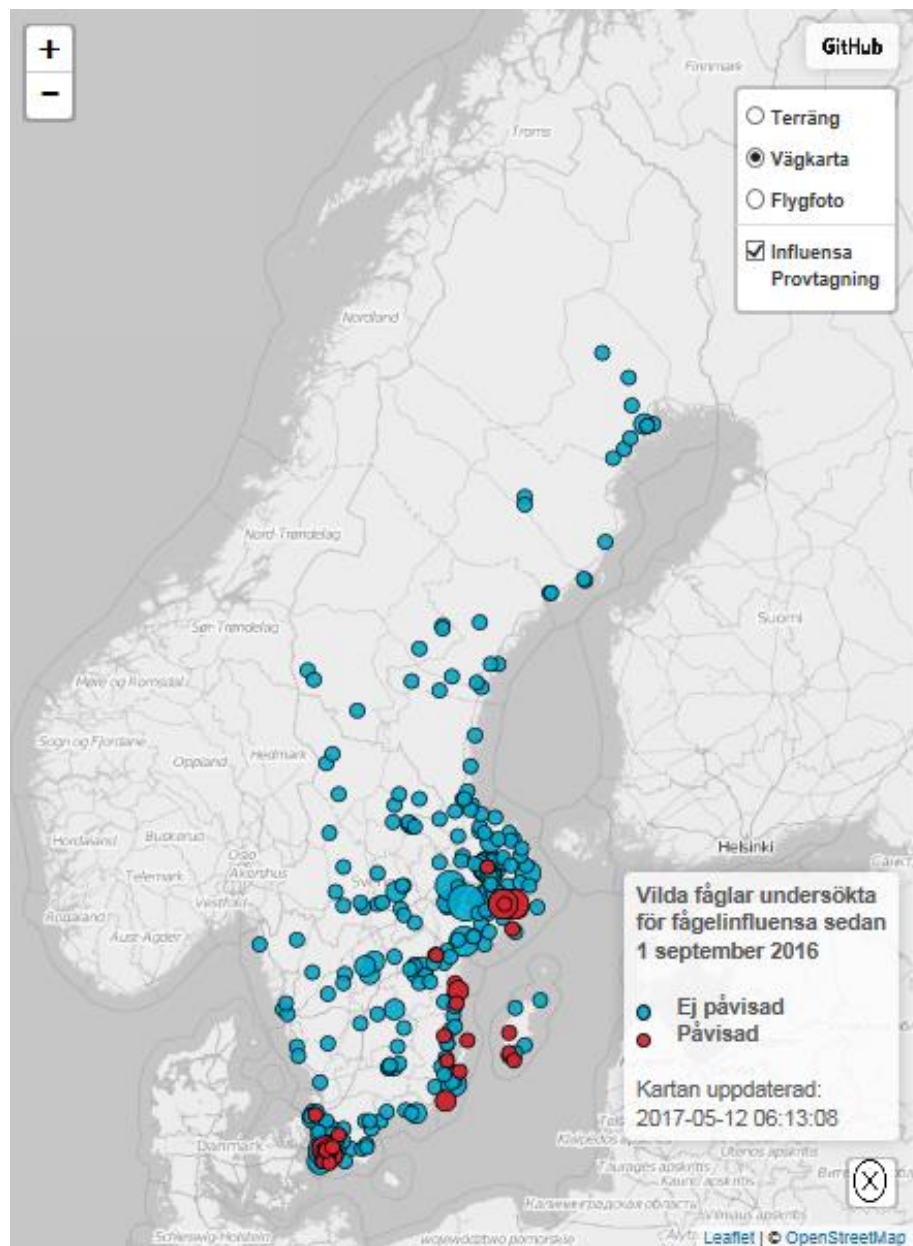
Summary - HPAI in Poultry

- Totally 6 outbreaks:
 - ❖ 2 farm with laying hens,
 - ❖ 3 small backyard farms,
 - ❖ 1 city park-zoo.
- Cleaning and disinfection of premises IP 1-5 is clear.
- All restrictions – except for IP 6 - are lifted.
- All poultry in Sweden was kept indoors to prevent further outbreaks in poultry between 21 November 2016 and 30 March 2017.
- Poultry producer organizations conducted additional meetings with producers with outdoors laying hens and ecological production to emphasize the importance of continuation of biosecurity measures, above all preventing contact with wild birds.

Summary HPAI in wild bird

In total 57 wild birds confirmed with HPAI H5 until 4 May 2017 in Sweden.
