6 new HPAI outbreaks in poultry and 3 HPAI cases in wild birds since the last SCoPAFF meeting on 17 January 2023

> POULTRY

6 HPAI H5N1 outbreaks in 4 regions: 3 backyards and 3 commercial holdings

- Central Bohemian Region (3 outbreaks)
- Plzeň Region (1 outbreak)
- Hradec Králové Region (1 outbreak)
- South Bohemian Region (1 outbreak)

> WILD BIRDS

3 HPAI H5N1 positive cases in wild birds in 3 regions:

- Moravian-Silesian Region (one mallard)
- Central Bohemian Region (one mallard)
- Hradec Králové Region (two mute swans)





COMMERCIAL HOLDINGS

Outbreak No. 2023/8, Central Bohemian Region


- commercial holding of breeding ducks (juvenile ducks) with approx. 1 900 birds, located in the surveillance zone of the previous outbreak No. 2023/3
- without suspicion: sampling before the planned movement of birds
- increased mortality of ducks occurred after confirmation of the AI virus
- AI H5N1 confirmed on 13 January 2023, HPAI on 16 January 2023
- restricted zone established on 16 January 2023
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holding, disposal of carcasses and preliminary cleaning and disinfection were performed on 17 January 2023

COMMERCIAL HOLDINGS

Outbreak No. 2023/10, Hradec Králové Region

- commercial holding of breeding ducks with approx. 23 000 birds
- suspicion: drop in egg production
- AI H5N1 confirmed on 18 January 2023, HPAI on 19 January 2023
- restricted zone established on 20 January 2023
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holding, disposal of carcasses, poultry products and preliminary cleaning and disinfection were performed on 21 January 2023






COMMERCIAL HOLDINGS

Outbreak No. 2023/11, Central Bohemian Region

- commercial holding of fattening ducks with approx. 10 000 birds
- suspicion: increased mortality of ducks
- AI H5N1 confirmed on 25 January 2023, HPAI on 26 January 2023
- restricted zone established on 26 January 2023
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holding, disposal of carcasses, poultry products and preliminary cleaning and disinfection were performed on 27 January 2023
- no animals have been moved from the outbreak to other Member States or Non-EU countries in the relevant 21 days before the confirmation of the outbreak

BACKYARDS


3 outbreaks HPAI H5N1:

- No. 2023/9 5 January 2023, Central Bohemian Region, 6 laying hens
- No. 2023/12 31 January 2023, South Bohemian Region, 34 birds (laying hens, guinea fowl, ducks)
 - the surveillance zone (10 km) extends beyond the territory of the Czech Republic to Austria
- No. 2023/13 1 February 2023, *Plzeň Region*, 18 laying hens
- poultry and poultry products for private use only (non-commercial holdings)
- a higher mortality of birds, clinical sings
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holdings, disposal of carcasses and poultry products, preliminary cleaning and disinfection
- restricted zones established around all outbreaks



Restriction zone (protection and surveillance zone) established in the Czech Republic (*Moravian-Silesian Region*) due to HPAI outbreaks in poultry in Poland (No. 2023/35 and 2023/37) close to the Czech-Polish border
