Centre d'aprofitament alimentari **mercabarna**

Started: 1 February 2022



Construction of a new 900 m2 facility at Mercabarna, located next to the Recycling Centre, which is integrated as an essential element of infrastructure of the Food Unit's organic waste management system.



Objectives of foodback

- Maximize food recovery and the reduction of organic plant-based waste through an integrated waste management system in the Food Unit.
- **Involve wholesale companies** in the joint fight against food waste.
- Guarantee the **traceability** of the management of surplus products (from reception to distribution) and **food security**.
- Professionalise the selection process and promote social and occupational integration.
- **Guarantee the distribution of the recovered food items** to benefit vulnerable individuals, through the entire network of social community organisations.
- Contribute to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals.

Objective: management of surpluses mostly NOT fit for human consumption





Food recovery goal



Since 2015 Mercabarna has audited and quantified, using scientifically-based data*, its **food waste** with respect to the total of almost 2 million tonnes of fruits and vegetables that enter the facilities.

Food recovery goal



With the launch of Foodback and Mercabarna's new waste management system, the recovery of:

NOW 1,000 tonnes/year 1st 2,000 tonnes/year phase 2nd 3,000 tonnes/year phase 3rd 4,000 tonnes/year phase

Origins of foodback

2002: Mercabarna gives the Food Bank a warehouse within the Food Unit, to receive surplus fruit and vegetables from wholesale companies in the form of donations;, sort them and distribute the usable products through community organisations. Warehouse expansion in 2015.

2015: UAB-Spora-PAA study to diagnose waste at the Food Unit.

2016: Manifesto for food waste reduction signed by all the Food Unit's business associations.

2021: Creation of **UPC-Mercabarna Chair** to quantify food waste in the Food Unit.

Transfer of the future Foodback infrastructure to the **Food Bank**

2022: Launch of Mercabarna's **new organic plant-based matter management system** (recycling centre, Foodback and smart waste containers)
