

Amendment DR (EU) 2023/361 on Vaccination (Cat. A diseases)

New and revised annexes – Updates and corrections in articles

First Expert group meeting, 24 January 2025

Pour mémoire

- Already shortly after first adoption, a revision was considered to update annexes.
- Scheduled for 2024 and adoption in Q1 2025, but postponed due to 2024 Animal Health situation, mainly PPR and SPGP.
- New events (SPGP), or scientific/technical data (ASF) and EFSA opinion (HPAI) made these changes even more relevant.

Amendments: articles and annexes

1. Articles:

- ➤ Definition of 'recovery period' changed to 'waiting period' and slightly modified for consistency;
- >Articles 3, 4, 7, 9, 13 and 16 modified for clarity and consistency;

2. Annexes:

- ➤ Annexes VIII (RVF) and X (PPR): small changes in Part 1;
- ➤ Annex IX (LSD): substantial changes in Parts 1 and 3;
- Revised Annex XII for CSF
- New Annexes XV (CSF wild), XVI (ASF), XVII (ASF wild) and XVIII (SPGP)

Amendments: article 2 - Definitions

- > Definition of 'waiting period': more consistent with rules and intent
 - ✓ No 'animal health status' granted for category A diseases = no 'recovery'
 - ✓ The period is meant to demonstrate the absence of disease before lifting the movement restrictions measures
 - ✓ 'waiting period' means the necessary period of time required to demonstrate absence of the category A disease after emergency protective vaccination against the disease has been carried out in a vaccination zone;
- >This implies corrections in article 16 and in all the annexes
 - ✓ Parts 3 and/or 4 of annexes: replacement of 'recovery period' with 'waiting period' (as well as removal of any references to WOAH terrestrial code chapters for diseases with WOAH granted official status)

Amendments: other articles

- >Article 3: correct reference and syntax
 - √ 'first subparagraph' becomes 'first paragraph'
 - ★ that which the Member States may allow outside irrespectively of the official disease prevention and control measures referred to in paragraph 1,
- >Article 4: addition
 - √ 'types and' added before 'use comply with the conditions'
- >Article 7: consistent terminology
 - ✓ In 1.(a)(ii), 'which is' replaced by 'and', and 'affected' deleted
 - ✓ In 2., 'zones' is replaced by 'areas', and 'or area' is added after 'zone'



Amendments: other articles

- >Article 9: consistency
 - ✓ In paragraph 1, point (b)(i), deletion of 'in order to prevent spreading of the category A disease from affected areas to non-affected areas'
 - ✓ Addition of 'or when the whole country is a vaccinated zone,'
- >Article 13: consistency, relevance
 - ✓ In paragraph 2, addition of 'and c', and deletion of 'they are either: (i) not subject to prohibitions of movements; or (ii) they are subject to prohibitions of movements but'
 - ✓ In paragraph 3, deletion of ': (a) they are not subject to prohibitions of movements; or (b)'



Amendments: other articles

- >Article 13 (ctd): consistency, relevance
 - ✓In paragraph 6, addition of 'if they are situated in a restricted zone in accordance with Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687,'
- >Article 16: consistency
 - √ Title is changed 'Waiting periods' etc.
 - ✓ In point 1, replacement of 'recovery' with 'waiting'
 - ✓ In point 1, addition of 'Articles 13 to 15 apply and'



Amendments: Annexes not scheduled for substantive amendments

➤ Annex VII (FMD)

- ✓ Deletion of reference to WOAH Terrestrial Code...
- ✓ Replacement of 'recovery' with 'waiting'

➤ Annex XI (AHS)

- ✓ Deletion of reference to WOAH Terrestrial Code...
- ✓ Replacement of 'recovery' with 'waiting'



Amendments: Annex yet to be drafted

Annex XIII (HPAI)

- ✓ mainly based on EFSA scientific opinion
- ✓ vaccination / peri-vaccination zones
- ✓ update surveillance requirements:
 - o appropriate sensitivity for early detection and confidence for disease freedom
 - for captive birds
- ✓ movement requirements for vaccinated captive birds from confined establishments



- >Annex VIII (RVF): no specific rules for the size
 - ✓ Part 1, paragraph (1): '1. Size of the vaccination zone: No specific rules.'
 - ✓ Better to have a less restrictive approach RVF never occurred in Europe hence difficult to know in advance what will be the best choice of vaccination zone
- **➢** Annex X (PPR): minimum standards for vaccine coverage
 - ✓ PPR : Category A disease Subject to swift eradication
 - ✓ Vaccination approach (if ever implemented): high vaccine coverage in short period to stop disease spread and then stop vaccination when confident about disease control – back to freedom.
 - ✓ Sub-optimal vaccine coverage : compatible with PPR endemicity (not desirable)

>Annex IX (LSD): 2 issues that need to be addressed

✓ Absence of rules/procedure for changing a Vaccination zone II to vaccination zone I

✓ Movements of animals during the waiting period



>Annex XVIII tbc (SPGP): new annex

- ✓ No specific rules on SPGP vaccination to date at EU level
- ✓ No specific rules on SPGP vaccination to date at WOAH level
- ✓ SPGP vaccination is now more relevant in view of the latest SPGP epidemics, especially those involving many animals in large areas (e.g. recent events in Greece, Spain, etc.)
- √ Same approach as PPR



- ➤ Annex XII (CSF): revision
- ➤ Annex XV *tbc* (CSF wild): **new** annex
- ➤ Annex XVI tbc (ASF): **new** annex
- Annex XVII tbc (ASF wild): new annex
- ➤ Annex XVIII tbc (SPGP): new annex



Revision of Annex XII (CSF in kept porcine animals)

- ✓ Addition of further requirements
- ✓ Part 1: size of the vaccination zone and minimum coverage
- ✓ Part 2: reinforced clinical and laboratory surveillance
 - Different in peri-vaccination/vaccination zones
- ✓ Part 3: 28 days after repopulation for lifting all restictions= two incubation periods
- ✓ Part 4: restyling



NEW Annex XV tbc (CSF in wild porcine animals)

- ✓ Drafted to fill a gap
- ✓ Requirements based on:
 - ✓ effective oral mass vaccination implemented to control CSF in wild boar in Germany between 2002 and 2025
 - ✓ scientific reviews and guidelines from the Commission



NEW Annexes XVI and XVII tbc (ASF in kept and wild porcine animals)

- ✓ Currently there are no safe and effective ASF vaccines for kept and wild porcine animals worldwide
- ✓ The annexes will provide a structured approach to the potential use of ASF vaccines, ensuring that (when available and holding a centralised marketing authorization granted by the Commission in accordance with Article 44(9)of Regulation 2019/6) they will be applied in compliance with the EU's legal and policy frameworks
