MEASURES (Action Plan)

- M1 Reviewing and disseminating food safety guidelines aiming to combat waste
- M2 Promoting consumer awareness actions
- M3 Implementing awareness-raising actions for the school-age population
- M4 Developing specific training actions for different segments of the food chain
- Regularly publishing a statistical panel of food waste levels, including the creation of an area dedicated to this topic in the official statistics portal
- M6 Disseminating good practice (guidelines and success stories)
- M7 Promoting the development of innovative processes





MEASURES (Action Plan)

- M8 Facilitating and encouraging the food donation scheme
- M9 Improving coordination and involvement of national administration in European and international regulation

M1 Reviewing and disseminating food safety guidelines aiming to combat waste

OBJECTIVES

Improving knowledge at all links in the food chain to reduce the waste generated and improve the safety of food donated.

DEVELOPED ACTIVITIES

- Production of guides to good practices and procedures for operators, by link in the food chain, as well as the dissemination of materials.
- Review of practices and procedures implemented in the field by the entities involved.
- Training was given to the specific links in the chain directly by the national bodies responsible for food safety and inspection.

EXECUTOR

Economic and Food Safety Authority, Directorate-General for Food and Veterinary (M1 and M4) and state-owned company who supports the fishing and fishing ports sector (M4)



Facilitating and encouraging the food donation scheme

Action 8.1 – Definition of common concepts and harmonised practices

OBJECTIVES

Promoting the donation of safe food through harmonised procedures

Action 8.2 – Assessment of food law rules and procedures

OBJECTIVES

Periodic revaluation and updating of the guidelines aiming at easily executed and well-perceived regulation

DEVELOPED ACTIVITIES

 Preparation of various documents on food donation (focusing on the types of food to be donated and the applicable rules) and provision of information on the websites of the entities involved

EXECUTOR

Economic and Food Safety Authority and Directorate-General for Food and Veterinary







M10

Implementing a collaboration platform to identify availability by type of food

OBJECTIVES

Facilitating the link between holders of food surplus and those who may need it, thus reducing the potential for food waste

Providing information on the ENCDA implementation and on food waste monitoring

Supply / demand collaboration platform

DEVELOPED ACTIVITIES

• Contract with an external company to implement a collaborative platform to bring together potential donors and recipients of products at risk of food waste (under development).

Office for Planning, Policies and Administration of the Portuguese Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Portuguese Environment Agency





M11

Promoting specific locations to sell products at risk of waste

OBJECTIVES

Ensuring that products near expiry date are provided with a commercial circuit that facilitates their consumption

Points of sale recognisable by the consumer

DEVELOPED ACTIVITIES

- **Portugal's voluntary agreement** was established in October 2018 by CNCDA. The aim is to ensure a commercial circuit in retail stores that facilitates the sale of food at risk of waste.
- As part of this agreement, the Portuguese Association of Distribution Companies developed communication campaigns to help consumers understand best before dates, reinforcing the prevention of food waste.
- The agreement's initiatives were accompanied by a system for monitoring and quantifying the products sold or donated.

2023

A total of 2676 stores took part in this initiative, and together they disposed of 27,000 tons of food products with an expiry date close to their expiry date.




Food waste figures in Portugal
