



# **HOW TO STUN/KILL POULTRY ON-FARM**

Poultry unable to be transported must be killed on-farm. They may also be killed on-farm for reasons such as illness, slow growth or to supply meat directly to consumers/retailers. Prior stunning is compulsory in all cases. Stun and **kill them as soon as possible** so that death is painless.

This information does not override **national rules** that forbid or restrict any of these practices.

Stunning and killing must be carried out by workers with an appropriate level of competence.

#### **ABOUT POULTRY**

- Poultry are social animals but can panic quickly
- **↑ Like**: well-lit areas
- → Dislike: direct sunlight, draughts

#### **REMEMBER**

Injured birds may not be able to move painlessly. Stun and kill them where they are as quickly as possible.



## STUNNING/KILLING

Once you have restrained the poultry, you can consider the following methods.

#### 1. HEAD-ONLY ELECTRICAL STUNNING


Since this method may not kill the poultry, you must bleed the bird within 15 seconds.

#### Position the electrodes

Electrodes are placed around the bird's head, between the eye and the ear

### Check the settings

- Current: chickens 240 mA; turkeys 400 mA or higher
- ◆ Voltage: above 110 V
- ♣ Duration: at least 7 seconds





#### Position the bolt

Place the bolt on top of the head, aiming down.

### Check the parameters

- Read the maker's instructions to check bolt, charge and pressure are appropriate
- → Penetrative: diameter min. 6 mm
- Non-penetrative: flat head for chickens; convex for ducks, geese and turkeys
- ★ Kill by bleeding within 1 minute




You may kill no more than 70 birds per day with this method.

## Restrain and position the bird

- ✦ Hold the bird by its legs
- Rest its head on a hard surface
- Hit the back of the bird's head with heavy. easy to handle object

#### Check for consciousness

After using the captive bolt, blow to head or dislocation methods, check for:




## 3. DISLOCATING THE NECK

Neck dislocation (or stretching) separates the spine from the head. You may kill no more than 70 birds per day with this method.

## Restrain and position the bird

- ◆ Use one hand to lift and hold the bird by its legs
- Close the fingers of your other hand around the bird's neck from behind its skull
- In one continuous movement:
  - 1. Pull both hands quickly and firmly in opposite directions
  - 2. Snap the head back sharply



## **AFTER STUNNING**

## If the bird is still conscious

- ♣ Don't bleed
- Stun again with a back-up method
- → Identify what went wrong
- Correct any problems before resuming stunning

### To confirm the bird's death, check for:

- No spontaneous movement
- ★ Limp carcass/wings
- No breathing
- Bleeding stopped



flexing/extending of legs

no regular breathing –

check between legs

(dislocation only)
