Implementing and delegated acts for applying the EU plant health regime

PLANT HEALTH REGULATION (EU) 2016/2031

OFFICIAL CONTROLS REGULATION (EU) 2017/625 All essential delegated and implementing acts are in place

Complementary acts adopted in 2021 and 2022

Food Safety



Plant Health Regulation High risk plants

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2018/2019

Receiving dossiers from non-EU countries to make the full risk assessment

by May 2023: <u>68 dossiers received</u>

66 accepted as 'complete' at COM level and 32 assessed by EFSA

28 finalised with

- Implementing Regulations amending Regulation (EU) 2018/2019
- Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/ 1213 + amendments with specific requirements for specified plants from specified countries



Plant Health Regulation

- Regulation (EU) 2019/2072 with 14 technical annexes
- Since November 2021, updated through four Implementing Regulations (2021/2069, 2021/2285, 2022/853, 2022/959)
- Amendment 2022/959 concerns the new measures against false codling moth, which reinforce the import requirements including obligatory cold treatment for oranges.
 - **Other Implementing Regulations:**
 - ❖ Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/1659 on equivalent requirements for the introduction into the Union of fruits of Citrus sinensis Pers., originating from Israel in view of the risks posed by Thaumatotibia leucotreta
 - ❖ Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/1941 on the prohibition of introduction, movement, holding, multiplication or release of certain pests pursuant to Article 30(1) of Regulation (EU) 2016/2031



Lists of measures

PAFF of April 2023, vote for a new Regulation on Tomato brown rugose fruit virus (ToBRFV)

It will be published by the end of May and apply from 1 June 2023; it will succeed Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1191

PAFF of April 2023 voted on a new Implementing Regulation, on Spodoptera, to address the recent outbreak in Cyprus

It will succeed Regulation (EU) 2018/638 and will apply from 1 July 2023

- OPAFF of April 2023 voted on a new Implementing Regulationwith a temporary derogation on the import of oak logs from the US and Canada
- oThree other derogations on import of ashwood and other types of wood will be replaced by an amendment of Annex VII to Impl. Reg. 2019/2072 with permanent measures

- The Commission is now examining the way forward





Official Controls Regulation

Frequency of import checks

Art.54.3 frequency of import checks

- Adoption of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/2389
- 100% controls on plants for planting and plants/plant products / other objects subject to the special measures of Art. 28 and 30
- Reduced frequencies for commodities listed in the Annex
